Nala shaah event took place in Ceerigaabo on October 3, in this quarter the nala shaah focused on the ceerigabo peace building and the negotiation between ceerigaabo community. The MPs are participating the current issue which is peace building and ISIR organizes the debate and session about “Peace Sustainability”

120 participants attended the event, where they listened to the debate and posed questions to the panel after it concluded. The discussion included 64 men and 61 women from various social groups.

Xildhibaanka La Shaah Event

On October 4, the Nala Shaah event took place in Cerigabo, centering on a debate about "**Peace Sustainability**." Various government representatives involved in peace negotiations in Cerigabo participated in the event. To bolster peace efforts, several Members of Parliament (MPs) from the House of Representatives joined other government actors to address pressing issues in the region. ISIR organized this debate, inviting MPs and other officials, including the Peace Committee and local municipality representatives, to raise awareness about peace within the Cerigabo community and to collaborate on making it a safer place.

The Institute of Conflict Resolution at Cerigabo University facilitated the debate, aiming to disseminate information about peace to both the local community and beyond. Maxamuud Caaraale Duur, the Secretary of the Peace Committee and former Interior Minister, advocated for peace, urging the Cerigabo community to maintain harmony and coexistence. Ridwan, an MP in the House of Representatives, also supported the peace negotiation process, emphasizing the importance of peace and encouraging the community to promote peaceful messages rather than those of conflict or violence.

Participants from various sectors of the Cerigabo community attended the debate, including youth clubs, women's organizations, traditional elders, and religious leaders. All emphasized the importance of peace and called on the community to support these efforts.

Parliament Oversight Visit Report

On 6 December 2025, the session 13aad of the house of representatives started and the house of representatives' members approved the agenda of the session 13aad. The agenda will focus the activities that the house of representatives work on session 13aad.

On 7 December 2025, the house of representatives welcomed the minister of finance and economic development and the minister presented the 2026 budget and distributed the MPs.

The minister requested the MPs to approve the budget and take a reading minimum the official time line to apply the budget for the beginning of January. The vice chairman of the house of representatives also encouraged the MPs to approve the budget with minimum time.

Meeting with Departments of Planning and Communication

The Planning and Communication Departments regularly meet to discuss departmental issues and needs, as well as to review ISIR's oversight activities. ISIR and the Communication Department have agreed to collaborate and have planned to support training on communication to effectively convey strong messages to the communities.

Gole Watch Posting

Gole Watch disseminates information about the sessions of the House of Representatives and other activities. It participates in the agenda-setting process and the presentations made by the Minister of Finance and Economic Development regarding the 2026 budget for the House of Representatives.

 - The Ceerigabo community embraces peace sustainability and encourages all community sectors to collaborate to maintain that peace.
 - The Department of Planning and Communication aims to continue the discussions and invites MPs to the sessions. The secretary has promised to notify the MPs prior to the debate and to reach out to those who are appropriate for participation.

The collaborative effort involves engaging with civil society organizations (CSOs) by coordinating meetings and inviting them to participate in events organized by ISIR, where they can share their insights. Additionally, we work with the Institute of Conflict Resolution at Ceerigabo University to promote peace and encourage the community to disseminate messages of peace.

The women's association in Cerigabo participated in the debate and delivered a speech to advocate for peace negotiations in the region.
